Term 3 summary:

Our Third Term of the 2021 school year has been a very busy and productive one! Our students, their families and staff have demonstrated a strong YOU CAN DO IT and engaged attitude when 'pivoting' in and out of lockdowns and learning both on-site and from home. Our families adjusted quickly to the new expectations of QR Codes and external collection points for their children. We 'settled' quickly back into the routine of Learning Pack collection and delivery. Thank you! Our school community has managed to keep to many of the routines and structures of a typical third term at Clunes Primary School and commits to conduct activities and events missed, where possible, in Term 4.

Thank you all for your commitment to our wonderful school and to the ongoing learning success of our students.

This term began on Monday 12th July. We:

- Conducted a weekly School Assembly; on-site and online
- Celebrated weekly Students of the Week! (on-site)
- Conducted weekly Student Leadership Meetings with our School Captains and School Vice Captains
- One of our Year 3-6 students, Zarah C achieved a Hepburn Shire 'Words in Winter' writing award
- Our Choir group conducted regular lunchtime sessions at the beginning of the term
- Students led a range of lunchtime activities including: Frisbee Club, Coding Club, Footy Club, Soccer Club, Garden Club, Mining Club, Friendship Club, ... All students enjoyed having the opportunity to practice their student voice via the school's PA system. A delight to be part of!
- Mrs Cassie Mitchell and Mrs Vicki Anderson continued to extend staff professional learning in leading Professional Learning Communities (PLC)- teaching and learning across the school. Both staff and Ms Jardine undertook a coaching professional learning day as a PLC 2021 school. Mrs Vicki Anderson attended High Ability training and Mr Ash Burke attended Small Schools Resilience Project training. Staff have engaged in further Literacy and Numeracy based in-house and external online professional learning. Miss Jordyn Dargaville, as a steering committee member, ensures that we are leading the way within the Central Highlands Area, in the implementation of the Marrung Indigenous Education Strategy.
- Comprehensive 3 Way Conferences were held for almost all familes. Thank you for your commitment to this process!

- For a short time we were able to implment a small group 'home grown' Kitchen Garden & Cooking program with Mrs Mitchell.
- Mr. Lewis supported another very successful and highly valued DRUMBEAT program. Hopefully there will be a whole school Assembly performance early in Term 4.
- Eligible families continued to receive support from the CSEF funding- supporting 'potential' Excursion and Incursion opportunites for our students. Extra funding from the Education Dept (DET) will see a reduced cost of Swimming for every participting child in Term 4. \$80.00 (TBC) per child in 2021.
- 2 x Junior School Council Meetings were conducted incorporating Student Voice and Student Agency into decision making within the school.
- A Pie Drive fundraiser, the Father's Day Gift orders and the Tree Drive fundraiser all raised valued funds to support ongoing resourcing projects at the school.
- Results of the annual DET Student Attitudes to School Survey (ATSS) were returned after the years 4, 5 and 6 students were surveyed online earlier in the year. Overall very positive data was received once again! Our student leaders will analyse the data when (hopefully) everyone is back on-site next term. Next term our students will assist with further analysis and then will make a small presentation to their class on the findings. Following class feedback, we will then take action to make ongoing improvements.
- The ATSS data will be presented to staff and to School Council at the beginning of next term and will be made public via the My School website and in our Newsletter.
- Staff actively participated in OH & S components of Staff Meetings, keeping the safety and wellbeing of all, foremost in our minds. On behalf of the OH & S Committee and school Mr. James completed an Annual Emergency Management Plan. Our school is formally recognised as a Category 4 Grass Fire 'at risk' school and will close on 'Code Red' days. This will be an ongoing focus leading into our Bush/ Grass Fire season.
- National NAPLAN Online assessment results have been recently returned. The data will be presented to student leaders and staff, and will be presented to school council and parents via the Newsletter early in Term 4. The data is also available via the My School website.
- Parents were randomly selected (computer generated sample) to participate in the annual, online,
 Parent Opinion Survey. Results will be made public once received by the school;
- 2 x engaging and proactive School Council Meetings were conducted. Training modules were completed for Finance and School Council President.
- Our students competed extremely well in the District Athletics and Xavier F competed at the Regional Cross Country event.
- Our annual whole school Children's Book Week Focus Day was postponed due to lockdown, however
 we will have a Book Parade, showcasing the efforts of our parents to dress up their children as their
 favourite book character early in Term 4. Our Clunes Library also had to postpone their planned
 activities with us.
- The Term 3 Disco will be postponed until the beginning of Term 4!
- We reviewed and re- affirmed our class and yard rules with our students in line with our School Values and Positive Behaviours approaches. Next term we will seek feedback from the school community with regards to our Student Code of Conduct, particularly with a focus to review the wording of our Behaviour Management Form.
- In this last week of term:
 - Our Year P-2 students are back on-site!
 - Our Year 3s- 6s are Learning from Home following our Learning Pack system and doing a brilliant job at committing to this process. Phenomenal efforts everyone!
 - Our last day of term "Footy Day" will look very different in 2021, with no parade or coin line fundraiser, however we hope that students will adorn their favourite footy colours, at home or at school, as a fun way to end the term.



Scholarships are available for Year 4-11 students, Year 12 students planning to undertake tertiary studies in 2022, and Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students planning on completing Years 11 and 12.

Year 4-12 student scholarships

The Department of Education and Training manages a number of scholarships which are available to students who are currently enrolled in Years 4-12.

Applicants for these scholarships are evaluated on their:

- participation in school activities
- community involvement
- academic record for the current year.

Scholarships are either one-off payments or for the duration of the student's course/study annually.

Applications for these scholarships, number of which have specific eligibility criteria, will open on 1 October 2021 and close on 28 February 2022.

2021 STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS FOR YEARS 4 -12

Principals, teachers, and careers advisors are encouraged to promote scholarships to their students

SCHOLARSHIPS' OVERVIEW

The Department of Education and Training (DET) manages a range of scholarships on behalf of various trusts.

Scholarships are available to students currently enrolled in Years 4-11 and for students enrolled in Year 12 who plan on undertaking tertiary studies in 2022.

Applicants for the scholarships are evaluated on their:

- participation in school activities
- · community involvement
- academic record for the 2021 school year.

Scholarships are either one-off payments or available for the duration of the student's course/study.

Scholarships may be targeted for students experiencing financial hardship and trusts may have particular eligibility criteria.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Students must be enrolled in Victorian schools and must be Australian citizens or permanent residents. Some scholarships are available specifically to Victorian government school students while others are available to students across all sectors.

CAN STUDENTS APPLY FOR MORE THAN ONE SCHOLARSHIP?

Students are encouraged to carefully identify and apply for all scholarships where they meet the

HOW MUCH ARE THE SCHOLARSHIPS WORTH?

Year 4 to 11 scholarships are one-off payments between \$300 and \$1,000.

Some Year 12 scholarships are one-off payments while others are paid for the duration of the course and range from \$600 to \$15,000 annually.

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE TO PRIMARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

John and Maud Askew Primary Scholarships

- Year 4 and 5 students valued at \$500
- Year 6 students valued at \$1,000

George Wilson Robertson Scholarships

Year 6 students valued at \$1,225

Victoria Police Scholarships

Only students who have a parent/guardian who is a member of the Victoria Police, a retired member or a Police widow or widower are eligible for these scholarships:

- One Graham Davidson Memorial Scholarship for a Year 6 student at \$800
- Two Angela Taylor Memorial Scholarships will be awarded for Year 8 students, valued at \$350 each
- One E C James Memorial Scholarship for a Year 9 student valued at \$900
- One Tynan-Eyre Memorial Scholarship for a Year 10 student at \$400, and one for a Year 10 Koorie student \$400
