# Apply Week 1 Term 2 2024 to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) for 2025

The Department of Education released a new state-wide timeline and process in 2023 for students enrolling in Foundation (Prep). This process will continue for the 2025 school year.

If you have a child starting primary school in 2025, an enrolment application will need to be completed by late July 2024. Information Packs including the Enrolment process and Application Form will be delivered to the Clunes Pre-School at the beginning of next week. You will also be able to collect it from our School Office and read more about it on our school's website.

It is important to follow the state-wide timeline to enrol your child in Foundation. Enrolling your child in line with the timelines allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.






