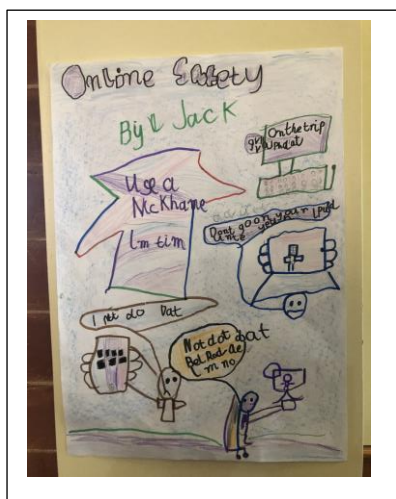

Term 3 summary:

Our third term of the 2024 school year has been an incredibly busy, positive and productive one! Thank you all for your commitment to our wonderful school and to the ongoing learning successes for our students.

This term began on Monday 15th July. Our students began the week with a NAIDOC Week focus. Our Term 3 will finish tomorrow, Friday 20th September, at 2.30pm. We will have thoroughly enjoyed a Junior School Council led fundraiser for Footy Day (Sports dress or Casual Dress is also okay!) don't forget the Parade at 8.45am! We will also have representatives of the Western Bulldogs provide activity sessions for all classes P-6.

Across Term 3 we also:

- Celebrated weekly Students of the Week!
- Conducted weekly Student Leadership Meetings with our School Captains and Vice School Captains. We all enjoyed having Lacey as our Student Principal for a Day.
- Completed an extensive School Performance Review! Thank you for your commitment to this highly valued 4-year evaluation process.
- Staff engaged in further Literacy and Numeracy based in-house, external and online professional learning.
- Mrs. B has supported students via the Tutor Learning Initiative in Literacy.
- We continued to use fundrasing money to support our very successful 'home grown' Kitchen Garden & Cooking program with Mrs Mitchell.
- Dedicated helpers continued with a very positive weekly Breakfast Program on both Thursdays and Fridays.- thank you Helpers! (Kylie, Ana, Denise and Rhiannon)
- Eligible families continued to receive support from the 'CSEF' funding- supporting Camps, Excursion and Incursion oportunites for our students. Multiple Grants/ Donations success has also meant that there have been significantly less costs for these extra-curricular events for all families in 2024. Thank you Year 3 and Year 4 families for delivering and collecting your students from the Log Cabin Camp. This kept the cost down considerably!
- 2 x Junior School Council Meetings were conducted incorporating Student Voice and Student Agency into decision making within the school.
- Student Attitudes to School Survey (AToSS) were returned after the years 4, 5 and 6 students were surveyed earlier in the term. Overall, our school has very positive data once again! Our student leaders will now analyse the data at the beginning of next term and our students within their classes will further analyse the results and then will make a small presentation to their class on the findings. Following class feedback, the school will take action to ensure ongoing improvement. Implementation of The Resilience Project has positively influenced a reduction in Low Resilience feelings for our Years 4-6 students. A continued focus.
- The Attitudes to School data (AToSS) and Staff Opinion Survey will be presented to staff and will be presented to School Council at the October Meeting. It will then be made public via the My School website and in our Newsletter.
- Staff actively participated in OH & S components of Staff Meetings, keeping the safety and wellbeing of all, foremost in our minds. On behalf of the OH & S Committee, the school completed an OH & S 'Intruder' drill with all students. We are formally recognised as being Grass Fire 'at risk'. This will be an ongoing focus leading into our Bush Fire season. Our school will close on CODE RED days. (At the beginning of Term 4 we will also practise a 'Relocation Drill' to Collins Place as required by the Department of Education.
- National NAPLAN Online assessment results were returned with some pleasing growth results in Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation, and Numeracy. The data will be presented to student leaders and staff, and will be presented to school council and parents via the Newsletter early in Term 4. The data is also available via the My School website.

- All parents and carers were invited to participate in the annual Parent, Carers, Guardians Opinion Survey. 34% of our parent community completed the Survey.
- We thoroughly enjoyed the African Drums incursion at school, led by Jonah and supported by Regional Arts Victoria.
- Our Prep students celebrated 100 Days at School!
- The Choir performance, as part of the Royal South Street Society Choral Competition, in the Founders Theatre at the Federation University, was very engaging! Thank you Wesley @ Clunes for providing us with a minibus!
- Wesley students also supported our literacy lessons on Fridays in P/1D and 1/2MJ and funded our Friday Fresh Fruit Platters! Thank you 'Roster parents' for preparing our fruit platters!
- One engaging and proactive School Council Meeting was conducted. Our Term 3 Working Bee achieved much and we already have a list of tasks to achieve at the early in Term 4 Working Bee, in readiness for bush fire season. We also have some concreting to do. Help please!
- Three of our students received awards for their entries in Hepburn Shire's 'Words in Winter'
- Our Year 6 Transition Performance 'Unchartered' was thoroughly enjoyed by students, staff, families and special guests. Thank you 'Asking 4 Trouble' crew; Luke, Christy and Bek for your dedication in implementation of the Creative Victoria grant. Our Year 6s moved well beyond their 'comfort zone'.
- Three of our students did extremely well in the District Athletics.
- Our whole school participated in a Children's Book Week Focus Day with a delightful Book Parade showcasing the efforts of our parents to dress up their children as their favourite book character and/or in the theme of 'Reading is Magic'. As usual our own Clunes Library supported us with an engaging activity, this year, for the P/1D class and followed it up with a Science Week – Robotics session for the Year 4 /5S class.
- Our Parent Fundraising Group once again provided incredible fundraising support with a delightful Father's Day gift arrangement, and very popular canteen at the JSC Term 3 Disco.
- The Term 3 Disco was, (as usual), a delightful event for both the Juniors and the Seniors as a combined event! Well organised JSC! And our parents enjoyed some social time in the Staff Room whilst the disco was being held.
- At the beginning of the term all classes reviewed and re- affirmed our class and yard rules with our students in line with our School Values and Positive Behaviours approaches, linking Respectful Relationships curriculum and The Resilience Project. Next term we will seek feedback from the school community in regards to our whole school excursions and our new Reporting format via Sentral!

School Saving Bonus

Information for government school parents and carers

About the School Saving Bonus

The Victorian Government is making life that little bit easier for families by providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

This support will help cover the cost of school uniforms, textbooks, and school activities like camps, excursions and sports.

The School Saving Bonus is in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) and the Affordable School Uniforms Program.

The School Saving Bonus will be provided to schools and families in Term 4, 2024.

Who receives the School Saving Bonus

The School Saving Bonus is available for parents and carers of all Victorian government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025, except for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers

Parents and carers of children who meet the School Saving Bonus eligibility above are required to do the following by **Friday 18 October 2024**:

- **Complete enrolment**

If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025, please complete enrolment. For more information, read about [Enrolling in School](#).

- **Check your contact information**

Ensure your contact information is up to date with your school. You can check this information by contacting your school directly.

Accessing the \$400 School Saving Bonus

You do not need to apply for the School Saving Bonus.

The Department of Education will email you in November 2024 with your \$400 School Saving Bonus. You will be able to access it via an online system.

You can decide how to best use the School Saving Bonus for your family's needs. You can choose how to allocate the \$400 in the online system.

The bonus can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

- camps, trips, excursions and incursions
- swimming and sporting programs
- outdoor education programs
- graduations
- school uniforms
- textbooks.

The bonus can be used at your school's approved textbook or uniform suppliers either in-store or online, or through State Schools' Relief. The list of suppliers may include a school uniform or bookshop. Any amount that you choose to allocate to textbooks and uniforms will be valid until 30 June 2025. It will then transfer to your child's school account for future activities.

Funds will roll over for use in future years if it is not all spent in 2025.

Families with more than one eligible child

Families who have more than one child at the same school can combine their School Saving Bonus payments to use on one child, or for a specific activity. So, for example, a family with 3 children who are all government school students would receive support to the value of \$1,200 and choose how they spend those funds. The School Saving Bonus cannot be combined across different schools.

Well, he's back out of retirement. Join him as he shares his love of Maths with a range of fun and challenging activities.



BUTTON UP IN THE COLD

Level 1 *You might choose to draw or model this problem.*

My coat has three different buttons.

Sometimes, I do them up starting with the top button. Sometimes, I start somewhere else.

How many ways can you find to do up my coat?

Level 2 *Drawing and modelling the problem is still an option.*

Now, I have a jacket which has four buttons.

Again, sometimes I do the buttons up starting with the top button. Sometimes, I start somewhere else.

How many different ways of buttoning it up can you find?

A challenge. *Try to do this one without drawing or modelling the problem*

(Can you see a pattern or a rule that might help you?)

Look back at the number of different ways you found for buttoning up three buttons and four buttons.

Can you predict the number of ways of buttoning up a coat with five buttons?

Six buttons ...?



Mathematics is all around us.



What mathematical questions could you ask (and solve) just by looking at this picture?

There are three main areas of Mathematics that you might ask questions about. They are:

- Number
- Measurement and Geometry
- Probability (Chance) and statistics

Here's an example of a question that you could ask:

There are 120 panes of glass. I was playing Cricket with my friend and the Cricket Ball accidentally smashed 'some' windows. How many windows remain in tact?

By having a number (120) in the question, and then using the word 'some' enables the activity to be achievable by more mathematicians - whether they are strong or developing.

A simpler option: In the doors there are 20 panes of glass, but the same question as above applies.

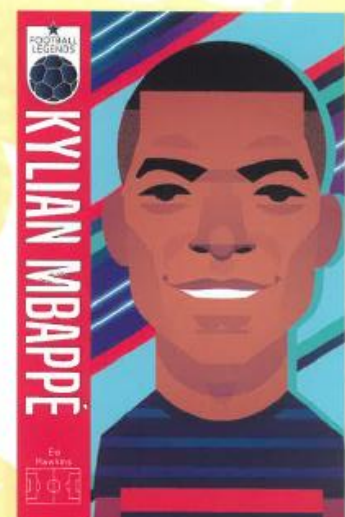
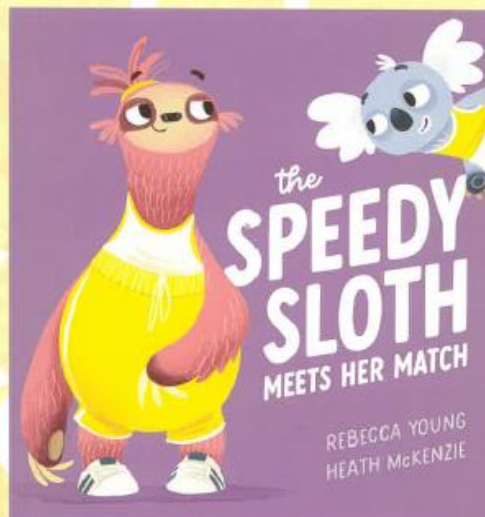
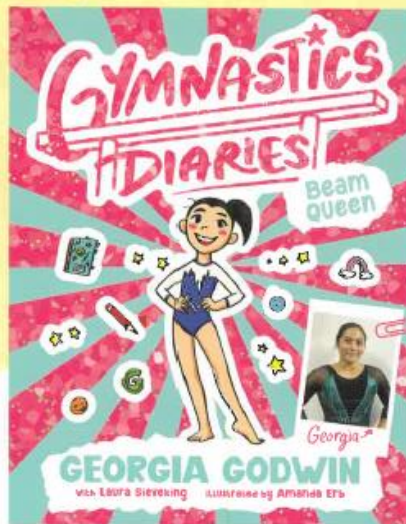
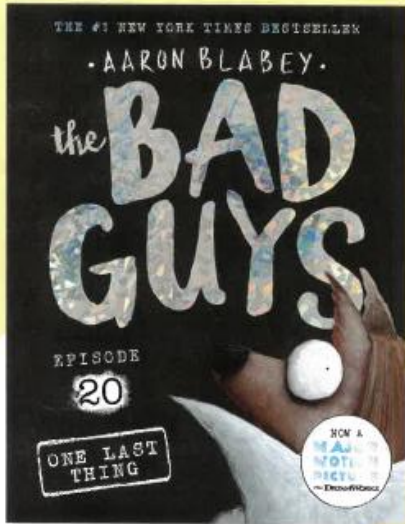
- 8.30am to 6pm (charged as a 9.5hr block) in the school MP Hall. Pick up and drop off can be any time between these hours.
